





AUTHOR CORNER

Maurice Sendak was born June 10, 1928, in Brooklyn, New York to Polish immigrants. He was both an artist and a writer, but is best known for his illustrations for children's books. Sendak's career began in art school where he started drawing comics and displays for toy stores. He first illustrated books written by other people--most notably *A Hole Is to Dig* by Ruth Krauss--but he eventually began writing his own stories to illustrate. He is probably best known for his book *Where the Wild Things Are*, which received the Caldecott Medal in 1964. Check out some of Sendak's work today, and enjoy his creativity!
