Some of the epic adventures we have planned for patrons include:


- Reading logs for children to chart their reading and inspire them to try new things and have a chance to win prizes

### Author Corner: Meet Gary Paulsen

Gary Paulsen was born May 17, 1939, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. His father was in the military, so the family moved a lot, and Paulsen experienced life in different areas. He served in the US Army, and also worked as a truck driver, editor, trapper, and other odd jobs before becoming a writer. Young people still enjoy Paulsen's coming-of-age books that often pit the protagonist against nature or needing to overcome some obstacle. His book *Dogsong* was a 1986 Newbery Honor Book, and *Hatchet* was a runner-up for the Newbery Medal in 1988. Paulsen enjoyed nature and adventure, and wrote nonfiction based on his experiences, as well as fiction inspired by his experiences.
